



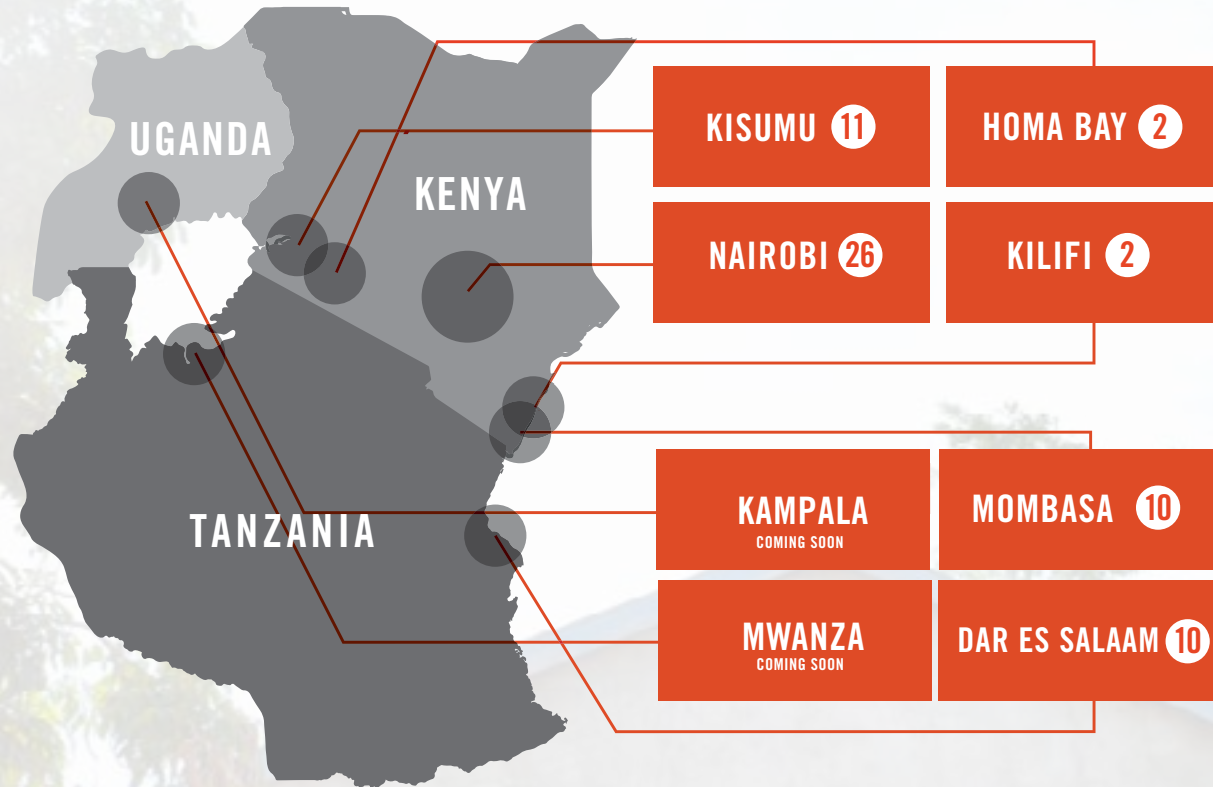

PHYSICAL HEALTH

- 42% had undetectable or low viral load at **INTAKE**
 - 83% had undetectable or low viral load at **EXIT**
- TARGET: 90% UNDETECTABLE OR LOW VIRAL LOAD AT EXIT**



ECONOMIC HEALTH

- 32% of clients were in a savings group at **INTAKE**
 - 96% of clients were in a savings group at **EXIT**
- TARGET: 100% OF CLIENTS IN A SAVINGS GROUP AT EXIT**



EMOTIONAL/SOCIAL HEALTH

- 50% had disclosed status to friends at **INTAKE**
 - 74% had disclosed status to friends at **EXIT**
- TARGET: 70% DISCLOSURE RATE AT EXIT**

CARE for AIDS SUPPORTS THE KENYA AIDS STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK

Kenya developed a country-specific AIDS Strategic Framework in 2014. This framework set forth specific goals for adherence, testing, stigma reduction, and special population care. The CARE for AIDS program directly supports the Strategic Framework goals 1-3*:

- 1 REDUCE NEW HIV INFECTIONS BY 75% BY 2030**
- 2 REDUCE AIDS RELATED MORTALITY BY 25% BY 2030**
- 3 REDUCE HIV RELATED STIGMA AND DISCRIMINATION BY 50% BY 2030**

CAROLINE

Caroline found out that she was HIV positive in 2007. She was in denial after her diagnosis and refused to take her medication. At the time, she had just birthed her second daughter and, because of her denial of her status, she unfortunately passed the virus on to her child. In early 2019 Tabitha heard about the CARE for AIDS program in Githurai from a friend who had graduated the year before. At first, Tabitha was hesitant, but after a few months of counseling, she has accepted her status and has grown to be very healthy physically and emotionally.

We are happy to report that her youngest son, Jaden, (pictured) is HIV-negative! The CARE for AIDS staff taught Caroline how to take all the precautions necessary to avoid passing the virus on to her baby. Caroline's dream is to one day open a home for young mothers who are HIV-positive. She knows firsthand how hard it can be, and she wants to mentor others so they can have healthy, thriving families.

CLIENT SUCCESS: PREGNANT MOTHERS

CARE for AIDS counselors train pregnant mothers in all of the necessary steps they can take to prevent transmitting HIV to their new babies. We are happy to report that 94% of the babies born to our clients are born HIV-negative.
